Child and Family Studies Columbia College Transfer Plan

In order to receive transfer credit, students must do the following:

- 1. Complete the approved Early Care and Education Associate Degree that includes specific courses identified by this agreement.
- 2. Earn no less than a grade of C in any course.
- 3. Meet with a Columbia College advisor before enrolling in coursework at Columbia College. (Recommended as soon as possible following Associate Degree completion.)
- 4. Complete additional general education courses (see below) either before or after transferring to Columbia College. These courses may be completed at either Columbia College or the regional technical college.

Students entering into the Child and Family Studies program at Columbia College will be subject to the requirements specified in the catalog that is current at the time of their matriculation into the program. Before transferring to Columbia College, students will be given an English, math, and language proficiency exam from Columbia College. Individual analysis of student transcripts will be made for credits accumulated under the semester system from the two-year colleges. Each institution and its authorized representatives agree to provide students who wish to transfer with relevant, current, and sound academic advice so that neither legitimate credit hours nor time will be lost in a student's attempt to secure the Associate and/or Baccalaureate degree.

The institutions reserve the right to modify requirements in accordance with the Commission on Higher Education guidelines, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) standards, NAEYC standards, and Columbia College's Child and Family Studies program changes. The attached list is part of this document and sets forth courses that satisfy General Education and Child and Family Studies requirements at Columbia College and the equivalent at the two-year college.

The maximum credit acceptable from a junior college is 72 semester hours, including a maximum of four semester hours in physical education activity courses. Degree applicants must complete a minimum of 25 percent of all courses required by the degree at Columbia College. This requirement means that at least 33 semester hours of course work must be taken at Columbia College for all programs except the B.S. in Biology with certification, the B.S. in Chemistry with certification, and the B.A. in Dance Education, which require 39, 34, and 35, respectively. A student must take at least 12 semester hours in her major at Columbia College. These 12 hours cannot include courses graded on a pass/fail basis. A student must take at least one-half of the hours in her minor at Columbia College.
